Black Cultural Zone CDC to Receive \$1 Million Wells Fargo Grant to Help fund Market Hall, Small Businesses, Affordable Housing

Donation puts Rise East at \$41 Million Mark, Will Assist Liberation Park

Development, Revitalize Deep East Oakland

WHAT: A \$1 million donation from Wells Fargo will help Oakland's Black Cultural Zone CDC purchase land to develop the <u>Liberation Park Market Hall and Residences</u> project in Deep East Oakland. The Market Hall will include vending space for BIPOC small business, cultural and performance space, 119 units of affordable housing, and create a stable economic hub for residents and families in East Oakland.

Rise East representatives will announce they've reached the \$41 million fundraising milestone in their effort to raise \$50 million this year, which if achieved, would unlock an additional \$50 million donation from a national philanthropic organization.
